



Martin Luther King, Jr.

Martin Luther King, Jr. (January 15, 1929 - April 4, 1968) was an American clergyman, activist and prominent leader in the African-American civil rights movement. His main legacy was to secure progress on civil rights in the United States, and he has become a human rights icon.

In 1964, King became the youngest person to receive the Nobel Peace Prize for his work to end racial segregation and racial discrimination through civil disobedience and other non-violent means. By the time of his death in 1968, he had refocused his efforts on ending poverty and opposing the Vietnam War.

He was posthumously awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1977 and Congressional Gold Medal in 2004. The Holiday was established as a US holiday in 1986.




February Events / Book Fair
